

U.S. exports to Canada



EXPORTERS LOSE THEIR OPTIMISM EDGE, TRAILING OTHER BUSINESSES.


Business Expectations Index, difference between goods exporters and all businesses






HOUSEHOLDS SPOOKED BY TARIFFS


Household plan to spend more cautiously

Share of workers citing weaker job security, %







Includes volume supply and machine, tool, die and mold plants


